

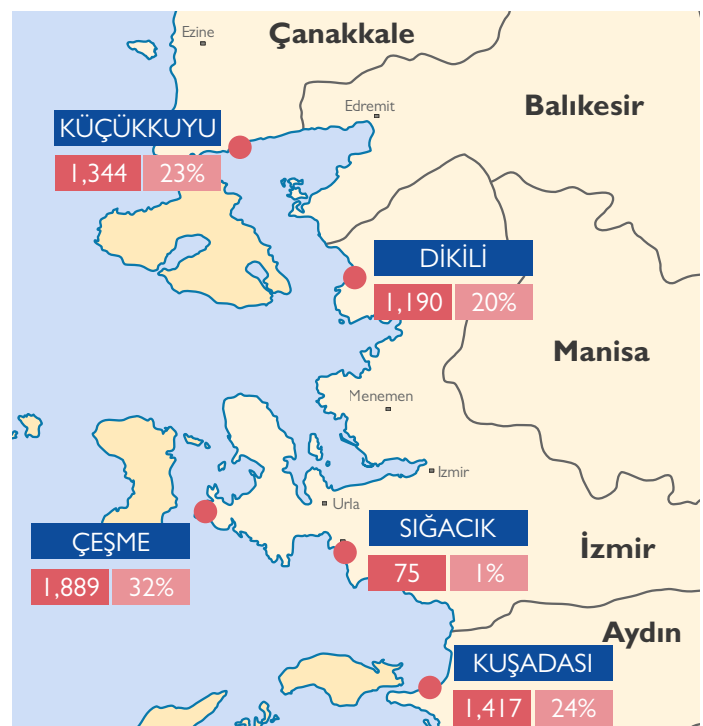

### IOM SUPPORT FOR MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES RESCUED AT SEA

IOM mobile teams work with the Turkish Coast Guard (TCG) in five locations along the Aegean Coast. The teams present in Dikili, Çeşme and Küçükuyu, are made up of interpreters, field assistants and social workers. Mobile teams provide interpretation assistance, food and non-food items (NFIs) such as blankets and dry clothes, psychosocial support (PSS) including counselling on legal rights, available services and recreational activities with children. The teams also identify and refer vulnerable migrants with specific needs. Additionally, food and NFI assistance is provided at TCG premises in Kuşadası, Ayvalık and Aliağa and/or other locations as necessary. IOM also provides tarpaulin tents to be utilized for the benefit of refugees and migrants rescued at sea to the TCG, Police and Gendarmerie, such as tarpaulin tents to host rescued migrants and refugees in waiting areas while they receive assistance.

From January to June 2019, a total of 5,915 migrants and refugees (46% of the total rescued by the TCG) were assisted by IOM. 178 of them with special needs were referred to UN organizations, international and local NGOs. Special needs include legal counselling, medical treatment, family reunification, identification of separated and unaccompanied children, psychosocial support, and socio-economic support.



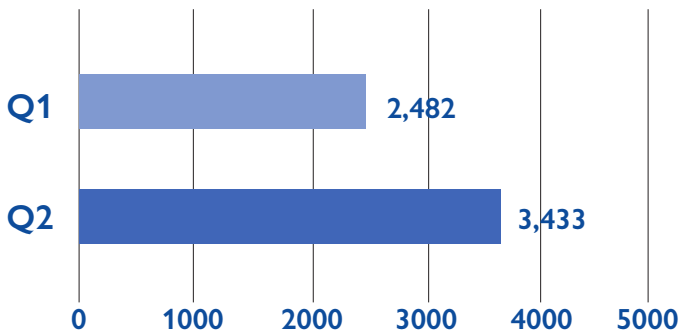
Beneficiary Numbers and Percentages by Location

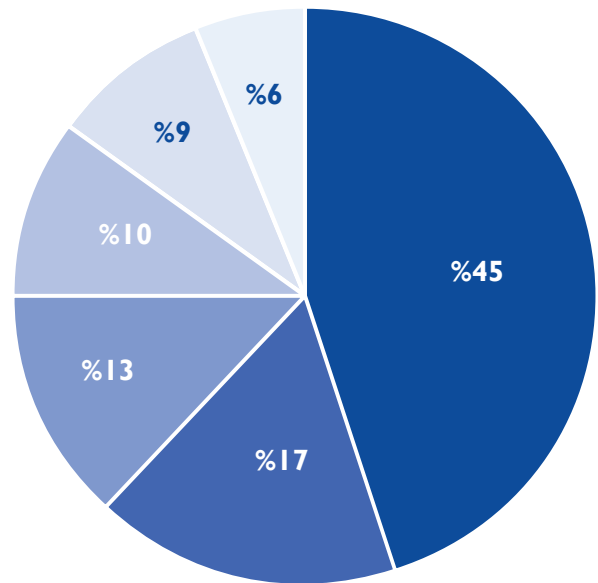
IOM Beneficiaries per Quarter



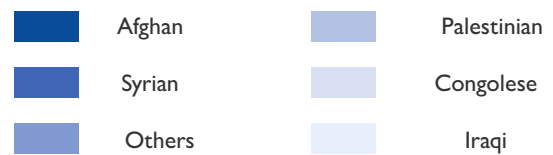
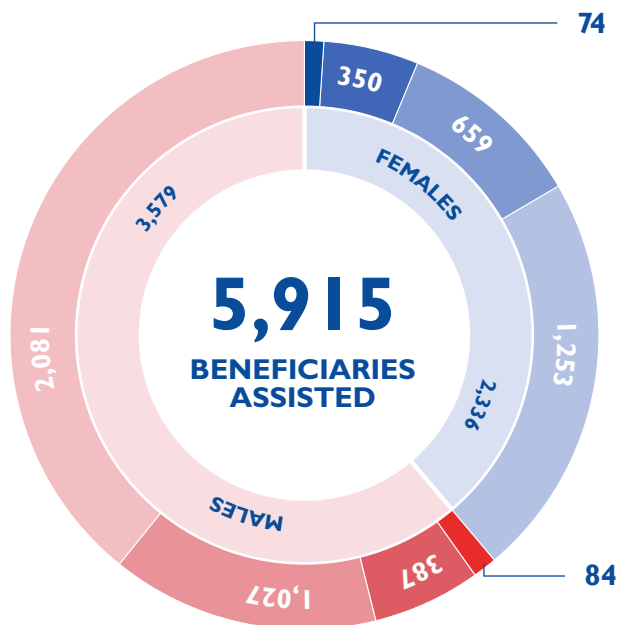
Since the beginning of 2019 the IOM Mediterranean Response Programme has assisted 5,915 migrants and refugees. This is a 30% decrease compared to the 8,507 assisted in 2018 within the same period. Since 2016, IOM has reached 46,139 migrants and refugees in total. A breakdown of assistance for 2019 January to June is as follows:

- 3,079 received interpretation support;
- 2,752 received psychosocial support;
- 124 participated in recreational activities.
