IOM RESPONSE TO THE SYRIA CRISIS

JANUARY - MARCH 2022





SUMMARY


The humanitarian situation in northwest Syria (NWS) remains grave with the continuation of hostilities in Idleb and northern Aleppo during the first quarter of 2022. The worsening economy is further exacerbating humanitarian needs, especially following the Ukraine crisis, NWS saw a shift in resources towards the response in Ukraine and has been affected by food and fuel shortages, all while continuing to be impacted by COVID-19. IOM continued to respond to these challenges and recently began to support the health system by funding one primary healthcare facility and one mobile clinic to serve beneficiaries. During this quarter IOM transshipped 207 trucks of assistance, including aid that responded to beneficiaries who were affected by the snowstorms that hit NWS in January and February. More than 1,400 sites sites were reached by IOMs CCCM Mobile Assessment Teams to refer beneficiary needs, and almost 2900 families received high-quality tents, while over 28,000 people received NFI distributions. Additionally, almost 15,000 people benefitted from camp infrastructure upgrades to help provide better insulation and protection from floods in the winter months. IOM also continues to serve 32 sites with emergency wash services, including 11 planned camps which also coordinate and provide multisectoral services including camp management, food, livelihoods, protection, and health. IOM continued to provide mental health services, child protection, gender-based violence support, legal awareness services, and explosive ordnance risk education to improve the protection of communities. To meet the needs of food-insecure families in NWS, IOM provided cash for food, food baskets, and ready to eat rations to different families, while also aiming to increase the resilience of beneficiaries by providing cash for work opportunities and business development support. IOM also continues to build the capacity of humanitarians working in NWS, providing training across multiple topics. In Q1 2022, IOM reached over 318,000 beneficiaries.






